'Spider Plant'

Chlorophytum

Spider Plant has striking foliage that will add contrast and texture to your plant collection. It is one of the most tolerant houseplants you can grow. Spider Plant produces runners, which develop plantlets at the ends. These look like spiders, giving the common name.

Sunlight: Bright light. Keep plant out of direct sunlight because it can scorch leaves.

Water: Keep soil evenly moist.

Humidity: Moderate. If the leaves turn brown and crispy, raise the humidity by misting.

Temperature: Average room temperature (65-75°F/18-24°C).

Feed: Feed every 2 weeks in spring and summer with a balanced liquid fertilizer, such as Baby Bio.

Repotting: In spring. Only repot when the roots are visable or it is pushing up from the pot.

Top Tip: Brown leaf tips are often caused by fluoride in tap water. For best results, let tap water sit for 24 hours, allowing chemicals to evaporate. Snip off brown leaf tips with scissors to keep the plant looking neat.
