

Yucca

More than 20 species of yucca exist. Colouration on yucca plants range from green to bluish with variations of cream, yellow and white, depending on the cultivar. Once placed in a sunny to partly shaded indoor location, yuccas are relatively easy to maintain.

Sunlight: These plants prefer bright, unfiltered light and thrive in full sunlight, making them well-suited for west-facing windows where they can receive plenty of sunshine.

Water: During the spring and summer growing season, water regularly while ensuring excellent drainage to prevent water from accumulating. Allow the soil to dry out between waterings and never let the plant sit in a tray of water.

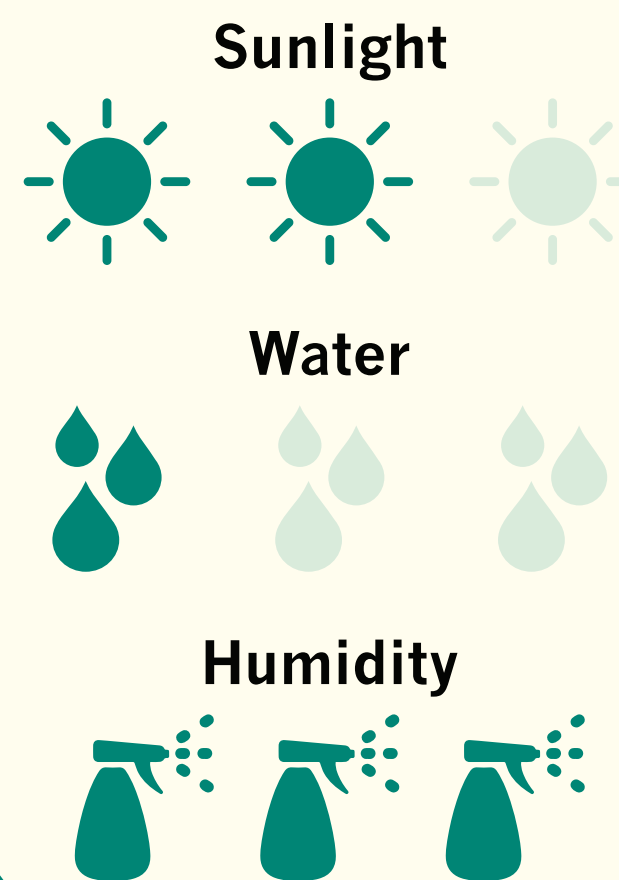
Humidity: Yucca plants generally tolerate a wide range of humidity levels, but they prefer average to moderate humidity, ideally around 40-50% relative humidity.

Temperature: They are adaptable to a wide range of temperatures, reflecting their desert origins where temperatures can be extreme.

Feed: During the growing season, feed them with either liquid or controlled-release fertiliser.

Repotting: Repotting is necessary when the roots outgrow the pot, use a loose, well-drained potting mix.

Top Tip: Overall, Yuccas are dramatic, architectural and easy to care for.
