

'Dragon Tree'

Dracaena

Its dramatic form makes a striking floor plant. Madagascar dragon tree is a bold accent if you have the space. Its daring, upright form punctuates the decor like an exclamation point, adding excitement to any room. Although tropical by nature, it adapts beautifully to average home conditions. In fact, it does so well on its own, that you don't need to fuss over it at all. As the plant grows, it forms a cane-like stem with a cluster of leaves at its top.

Sunlight: Moderate to bright light. Keep plant out of direct sunlight which can scorch its leaves, leaving brown marks. Pale leaves can indicate that light is too low.

Water: This Dracaena plant will tolerate many abuses, but not soggy soil. Water thoroughly, but allow the top inch of the soil to dry out between watering. Water less in winter, when light levels are lower and growth has slowed.

Humidity: Medium – high. Increase humidity by misting the plant on a regular basis.

Temperature: Average room temperatures (60-75°F/16-24°C).

Feed: Feed monthly year-round with a balanced liquid fertilizer, diluted by half.

Repotting: Cut off the cane at any height and root them like stem cutting.

Top Tip: You can cut off the cane at any height. It will sprout a new cluster of leaves from where it was cut.
